Apply to DSU every year, https://ushece.service-now.com/concurrent_enrollment
Register for classes at DSU, <https://concurrent.dixie.edu/registration/>
Pay your fees
Confirm your registration with your teacher

I passed my AP test now what?
Bring your scores to your counselor and registrar's office at the College/University of your choice. Scores are not automatically placed on your transcripts.

How do I get a copy of my ACT Score?
You'll need to get them directly from you ACT, <https://my.act.org/account/signin?location=https://my.act.org> There will be several

options to choose from, so please read them carefully to avoid delays.

Can you send my transcripts to NCAA?

Yes, but please make sure you've created an account prior to requesting.

Do you send my ACT scores to NCAA?

You're ACT scores are listed on your transcript, however NCAA requires they be sent directly from ACT. They will not accept them from your High School.
